

Stained Glass Rose Window

“Rose” or “Catherine” windows date back to the twelfth century. These Gothic stained glass windows were found in Cathedrals throughout France, and also enjoyed limited popularity in other countries, including Spain and England.

Rose windows are typically round, and divided into separate parts. Their appearance resembles a rose with many petals.

Since much of the medieval population was illiterate, there was great significance placed on symbols in the artwork of the period. The colors of the glass used and the number of sections in the windows were important parts of the stories they told.

Materials

- Prang Washable Art Markers Including any of the following:
 - 80680 – Set of 8 Colors
 - 80613 – 200 ct Classroom Masterpack
 - 80614 – 96 ct Classroom Masterpack
- Prang Metallic Art Markers:
 - 80597 – 2 ct Silver & Gold
 - 80598 – 6 ct Assorted Colors
- Ticonderoga RediSharp Permanent Markers:
 - 97207 – 12 ct Black Fine Point
- Coffee filters (or Color Diffusing Papers)
- Paper towels
- Paint brush & water bowl (or spray bottle)
- Newsprint or other clean scrap paper

Alternate Materials

- Prang Classic Art Markers Including any of the following:
 - 80128 – Set of 8 Colors
 - 80012 – Set of 12 Colors
 - 80848 – 48 ct Tub (12 Colors)
- Ticonderoga RediSharp Plus Waterbased Permanent Markers:
 - 98207 – 12 ct Black Fine Point

Directions:

1. Fold coffee filter into quarters and use a Prang® Metallic Marker to draw a design.
2. Refold coffee filter so that a clean quarter is on top and you can see the already designed quarter beneath. Trace over the design onto your clean quarter.
3. Repeat Step 2 onto the next two sections until the entire circle is finished and has a symmetrical design covering the entire sheet.
4. Outline the Metallic Marker with Black RediSharp Marker.
5. Fold the circle into quarters again. On the top layer, fill in the white spaces with Prang® Washable Markers.
NOTE: Color should only be added on one quarter – water used in next step will allow color to bleed through.
6. Use a stiff paint brush (or spray bottle) to saturate the marker areas with water. Keep saturating the marker until it bleeds through all four layers of the filter.
7. Open and allow to dry.



Steps 1 & 2: Draw design on ¼ of coffee filter. Unfold & refold as needed to trace design to all quadrants



Step 4: Outline metallic design with Black RediSharp Plus markers



Steps 5 & 6: Color ¼ of design. Saturate with water. Allow color to bleed through to other quadrants.
